What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding for new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Each school receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year. In 2016/17 Mount Pellon Primary Academy was allocated £10,170. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. The money will be used so that all children benefit regardless of their sporting ability.

Purpose of the funding

All schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but there is freedom to choose how we do it. At Mount Pellon Primary Academy we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude, social skills and academic achievement of all children.

- Part fund an experienced sports coach to deliver high quality lessons
- Provide CPD for teachers and sports leaders through working with specialist coaches
- Provide training for Midday Supervisors to increase participation in physical exercise and constructive social engagement
- Enable and encourage children to participate in a range of after school clubs that support physical wellbeing
- Update and buy new sports equipment when needed to allow children to fulfil their potential across a wide range of sports
- Further develop the quality of PE teaching by introducing accurate assessment procedures
- Make links with local sporting teams/clubs to introduce children to a wider range of sports.
- Increase participation in sports competitions
